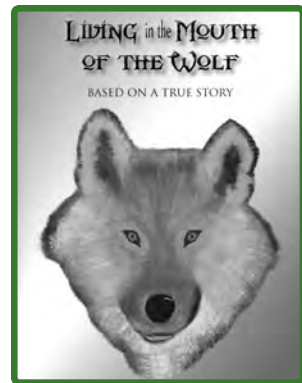
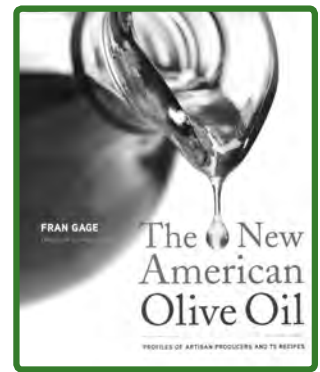

FROM TUSCANY: Sketches In Hilltowns and Countryside

An Exhibit by Artist Stephanie Taylor - Sept 30 - Oct 28

This past winter, artist and visual historian Stephanie Taylor traveled the Tuscan countryside with sketch book and paints in hand. Using the medieval fortress hilltop town of Anghiari as a base for exploring the Tuscan countryside, Taylor captures the Etruscan heritage and the continuity of the people, land and culture of Tuscany with the past in places that transcend time. From the Bell Tower of Siena, the fields of red poppies and yellow sunflowers, the vast forests of pine and chestnut, cypresses, umbrella pines and olive groves to Market Day in Angiari, her watercolors and pen on paper drawings provide us with a visual feel for the 3000 year preservation of their extraordinary countryside by the Tuscan people. The exhibit collection will consist of prints of selected sketches with the opportunity to purchase. Taylor will also give a visual show and discussion about her travels in Tuscany. ITALIAN AMERICANS AT BAT

From Sand Lots To The Major Leagues

Over 450 Italian Americans have played baseball in the major leagues since 1897. A new exhibition at the Museo Italo Americano details the history and contributions of Italian Americans to the sport of Baseball. The exhibition chronicles how Italian Americans broke into baseball in the early days against the initial prejudice, their triumphs along the way and the many legendary Italian Americans who have become some of the most celebrated names in this most American of games. From Ping Bodie in 1911 (Francesco Pezzollo) to Yogi Berra and Joe DiMaggio, they are all here in a visually exciting exhibit with vintage photographs like Joe DiMaggio hugging his brothers Vince and Dom before the 1936 World Series and memorabilia from the 100 year legacy of Italian Americans in Baseball. In the past 30 years, fourteen of the winning World Series managers have been Italian Americans. For over a century, Italian-named players have become national baseball heroes and have reinforced Italian American pride and Italian-ness among generations of Italian Americans.
