
Check into our centrally located hotel in Palermo before a special welcome dinner in a local trattoria which highlights local specialty food and wine. (B, D)

Today we will meet our local guide, and head to Monreale. This charming tiny town is home to a spectacular Cathedral which is regarded as the most beautiful of the Norman churches in Sicily and perhaps the world! The mosaics were made with 2200 kg (almost 5000 pounds) of pure gold! It is called the 8th Wonder of the World.

Years ago, when I first visited Cefalù I fell in love with this charming Norman town and am excited to share this special place with my travel friends.

Cefalù with its gorgeous Norman Cathedral and its spectacular seaside location and unique fishing village charm allows a glimpse at Sicilian daily life. All of

Today we will experience a Sicily few travelers ever see; we will experience this lesser-known Sicily, by meeting local people and participating in their daily lives. This journey back in time is in the ancient hamlet of Sant'Angelo Muxaro a tiny hilltop village of about 1300 residents. The town is steeped in legend and history, perched on the hill is the necropolis, with over two hundred tombs dug into the cave dwellings dating from the 13th to the 6th century BC. The city center and main piazza are a treasure chest of the wonderful beauty and authenticity of the territory.

Today's excursion allows us to enjoy the unique way of life of this little village made up of a few hundred families who live herding sheep to make the local cheeses. We will walk-through village street, meeting the towns' craftsmen, baker, cheese maker and other locals while enjoying their hospitality and tasting local specialties and genuine encounters with locals. We will make a stop to taste hand crafted cheeses, along with the local specialty of "pani cunzatu", a local bread made entirely from

local ingredients. We will taste local cookies, local wines, olive oil, and other seasonal artisanal products from the local area. We will enjoy the incredible hospitality of Sant'Angelo Muxaro as lunch guests in the home of friends Lina and Franco.

Valley of the Temples in Agrigento, declared a World Heritage Site by UNESCO, where among the almond trees there are the remains of the ancient Akragas, defined by Pindar as "the most beautiful city built by mortals". You can admire the temple of Juno, and the temples of Concordia and Hercules. A journey through mythology, history and nature will make this day unforgettable.

We check into our Agrigento hotel before heading to a local trattoria for a delicious dinner with local food and wine. (B, D)

Day 8: 29 April 2026- Modica-Scicli and Ragusa:

Sicily abounds with UNESCO World Heritage Sites and today we meet our local guide to discover the Baroque cities of Modica and Ragusa. Modica is particularly famous for its chocolate which we will sample along with Modica's famous Vermouth and Amaro liquor. This charming hill town has a remarkable number of impressive churches, including two grand Baroque cathedrals. This historical center is a Baroque jewel! Scicli is often chosen as a location for the "Inspector Montalbano" TV series; Montalbano fans can stroll past the "Vigata's Police Station" (which is the City Hall), where many scenes are filmed. Free time for lunch and shopping before heading to the ancient hilltop town of Ragusa. Ragusa is a stunning, baroque town spread across two hilltops. In incredible 14 of its 18 monuments are listed as UNESCO World

Heritage Sites. It has been made even more popular by the Inspector Montalbano books and television series. Check into our beautiful seafront hotel in Catania (Acicastello) and enjoy a traditional dinner. (B,D)

Day 9: 30 April 2026- Siracusa, Ortigia and Noto:

Siracusa, is considered one of the world's most important archaeological centers. We will meet our local guide to visit the Greek Theatre, and the Roman Amphitheatre which dates to the 5th century B.C. and the Ear of Dionysius. We will visit the Baroque city of Noto and known as "the garden of stone" which is an UNESCO World Heritage Site. Lunch is on your own and I recommend you don't miss enjoying a famous granita (lemon is my favorite!). Almost every person visiting Ortigia falls in love with this island, the beautiful piazza, the hospitable people, the sea, the views. We will enjoy an afternoon in Ortigia which is the oldest part of the city and was chosen by the Greeks for their first settlements. We will enjoy a two-hour boat tour in the Bay of Ortigia and the amazing sea caves and enjoy prosecco, local fare and fresh seasonal fruit. Return to our hotel for a wonderful dinner. (B, D)



Day 10: 1 May 2026- Mount Etna and Taormina:

Today we head north to the famous Mount Etna for an unforgettable visit to Sicily's volcano. We will explore the rich history and have a chance to walk on the black lava soil. We will visit a local honey producer and have a tasting of many of the precious products produced in this rich volcanic soil. Then we continue on to famous and stunning Taormina with our private, local guide. Taormina's history dates back to the 4th century B.C. Perched on the edge of a cliff overlooking the Ionian Sea, Taormina boasts an incredibly spectacular setting and breathtaking views. You'll view medieval buildings and ancient

ruins amid a fertile oasis of olive groves, grape vines and orchards. In the Old Town, stroll along Corso Umberto, filled with trendy shops offering everything from fashionable clothing to antique jewelry and furniture. Visit Teatro Greco (Greek Theatre) and the enjoy more incredible views of the bay. The rest of your day is free to explore the area's lovely restaurants, caffès, bars and elegant shops. Our farewell dinner features local specialties and wine. (B, D)

Day 11: 02 May 2026 - Catania Airport/USA

This morning after enjoying breakfast, you will check out of our hotel and transfer to the CATANIA airport for the flight home or to your next destination. Say "Arrivederci" (see you again!)

Terms and Conditions for Travel Sorrento and Sicily 2026 Tour

Passports and Visas and Vaccines: Each traveler who is a U.S. citizen must possess a valid U.S. passport with an expiration date **not less than six months after the tour return date**. US citizens will need to apply for travel authorization through the European Travel Information and Authorization System (ETIAS) to enter Italy and about 30 European countries. Make sure your passport details match those in your ETIAS authorization – you will be refused boarding and entry at the border if they do not match. To apply for the ETIAS please visit https://etias.com/etias-application. Travelers of other nationalities must contact the embassy or consulate of the destination country for entrance requirements. Passport and visa information may be obtained by contacting the Travel Advisory Section of the U.S. State Department at (202) 647-5225 or www.travel.state.gov. To obtain additional medical information, travel alerts and other information contact the Centers for Disease Control at (404) 332-4559 or www.cdc.gov.

<u>Traveler Notice:</u> Walking is required and is an important part of this tour. Travelers cannot require special mobility care. Travelers' mutual enjoyment of the tour requires no egregious, disruptive behavior. After first notice of such behavior, a second notice will be grounds to excuse the traveler from the remainder of the tour with no refund or credit.

Reservation/Initial Deposit: To secure a reservation for the tour, the traveler shall make a non-refundable initial deposit of \$500 per person. Deposit payment shall be payable to Ships and Trips Travel by check. Payment by credit card is subject to a 4% charge.
